Treasury maintains custody of this unclaimed property and works hard to return it free-of-charge to its rightful owners.

In 2009, Treasury reunited nearly 83,000 owners with their unclaimed property, returning nearly \$108 million. Treasurer McCord and his Return Team remain hard at work to locate the owners of nearly \$2 billion in unclaimed property.
